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BOARDERS

The boarding facility at Da Vinci International College is available for any student between the ages of 14 to 19 wishing to live and study in Bratislava. All boarders are housed separately on the ground floor.

Boarding is available from Year 7 and upwards, although some students choose to remain day pupils throughout their time at the college. Boarding at Da Vinci International College is flexible; children have the option of boarding from 2 or more nights depending on what best suits their needs. Younger students may start with two nights or more per week and gradually increase this as they progress through the School and grow in confidence. For the last two years in the School, the majority of students board full-time

Overview

Da Vinci International College aims to provide the very best in international secondary education. Our beautiful campus is exactly what parents and students would expect of a world-class school. Our spacious Domaine de Montleuze estate, located on the French Riviera has amazing views from numerous terraces and gardens. The campus includes a beautiful and fully renovated chateau, nineteen villas for classrooms and accommodation, swimming pools, sports facilities and much more.

The boarding facility is on campus and adjacent to the main teaching block. This means that students do not have to travel from dormitory to school and they are secure within the school campus itself.

The boarding facility is led by a live-in house matron who is on call at any time from 16:30 to the start of morning lessons. Matron is supported by other residential and non-residential staff members such as teaching assistants, security staff, housekeepers and teachers.

Boarding staff share meals with the students, care for the children when they are ill and generally take care of their day-to-day needs. In addition, our boarding matrons organise evening activities and weekend excursions as well as maintain close communication with parents.

Some boarders choose to go home to their families or to guardians at the end of the school week or Saturday morning and return on to Sunday evening or Monday morning. Those students who are full-boarders and normally stay at weekends often choose to return home for either a long weekend or school holidays. This means that few boarders spend more than four consecutive weekends at the school without going out to family and friends.

Any boarder is entitled to stay for the weekend at the School. Occasionally, day pupils may also board at weekends and are charged accordingly. However, this option is only available if there is free dormitory space.

The Boarding Facility

Girls and boys reside in different sections of the facility located in our beautiful, lake-side campus.

- 01 24-hour supervision by our experienced residential staff
- 02 Evening and weekend excursions and activities led by our residential staff
- 03 Three meals per-day plus three snacks daily, with access to the kitchen and dining hall throughout the day. The menu provides a choice of three options at each mealtime
- 04 Luxury villa accommodation has bedrooms for between 2 and 4 young people. Each villa has a shared kitchen, bathroom and common room with television and internet access
- 05 Access to all school facilities including the swimming pool, gyms and gardens

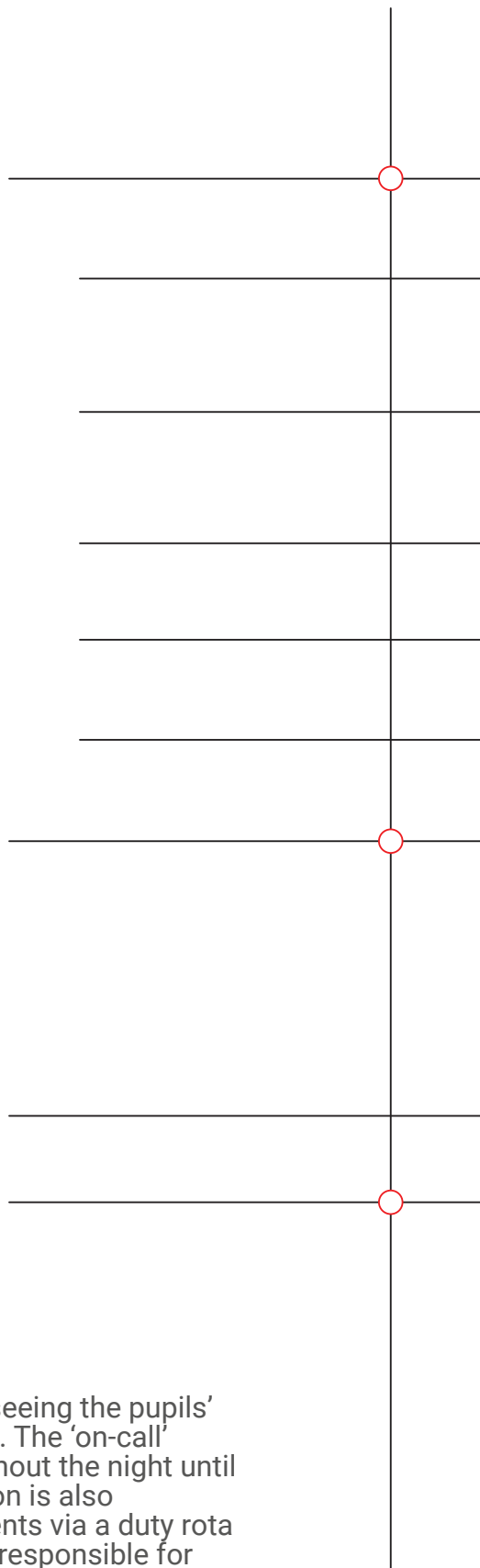

The 'on-call' matron is responsible for the boarders throughout the night until 7am the following morning. The 'on-call' Matron is also supported by boarding staff supervising students via a duty rota to ensure that at least one member of staff is responsible for each dormitory through the night.

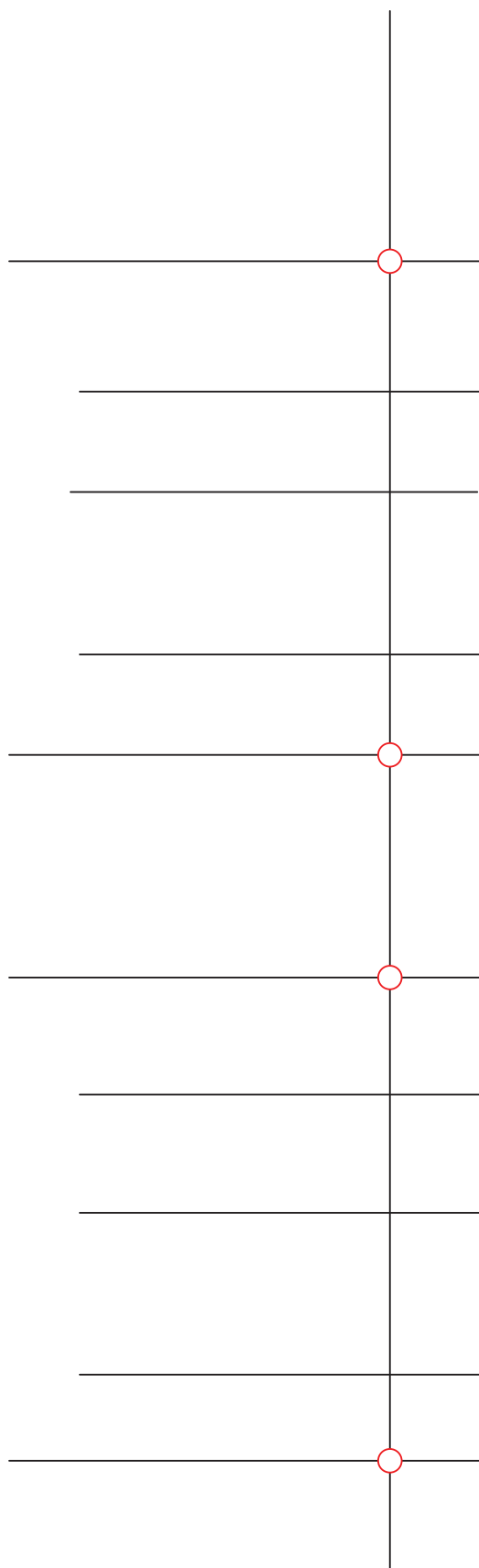

Healthy Living

Da Vinci International College promotes healthy living and balanced lifestyles for all members of the school community. We take the personal health and safety of all our boarders extremely seriously and to this end we monitor our provision as follows:

HEALTHY NUTRITION

Boarding students are provided with 6 meals per day – breakfast, morning snack, lunch, afternoon snack, dinner and evening snack. Our extensive kitchen facility means that we can provide a range of healthy choices to meet the dietary needs of individual students. The kitchen is always open and available at all times. On weekends, students also have the option of preparing their own meals. All of our food is prepared on site by our registered school chef, who prepares a variety of fresh, seasonal French and international dishes.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS AND TIME-MANAGEMENT

The academic needs of our boarders is catered for by our house matron and other boarding staff. Boarders are given support with homework, study projects, revision and enrichment activities. In this, our boarding staff help students make smart choices regarding time management to ensure they maintain a balanced life style. Boarding staff and teachers also support our boarders with their extra-curricular activities, hobbies and interests.

Parents are sent a regular newsletter to inform them about life at Da Vinci and announce upcoming events, excursions and so on. Information regarding individual students is communicated via school reports, personal emails or by telephone. For urgent matters, illness, inappropriate behaviour or other unforeseen incidents, parents will be informed immediately. Family members are always welcome to visit Da Vinci, although we would suggest that parents of boarders visit during weekends or short holidays to avoid disrupting school life.





PERSONAL SAFETY

Da Vinci takes the safety and protection of its pupils very seriously. All boarding staff must have Health and Safety and Child Protection Training (renewed every 2 years maximum). New boarding staff arriving between official courses must undertake a full safeguarding induction with Matron who is the designated senior person for child protection before carrying out boarding duties.

Boarding Staff must report any concerns to Matron as soon as possible (or Head Teacher in her absence) regardless of how small they may seem as. All concerns recorded and communicated to parents when necessary.

Boarding students receive regular briefings and training about personal safety:

- Regular fire drills in the boarding houses
- Slovak traffic and youth protection law
- Da Vinci policies and procedures for leaving the school campus

PASTORAL CARE

Members of staff have the option of living rent-free in an apartment on the school premises. Members of staff opting to live on campus are required to carry out boarding duties for a period of one half-day per week on a rota basis. Our boarding matron provides guidance and instructions for all residence boarding staff. Additional Duty Staff are employed at weekends to provide supervisions, lead in-school activities and supervise off-campus excursions.
